#### **NORTH COAST FARMERS DROUGHT APPEAL**

As you are all aware the Bexhill Public School students, staff and wider community have been working extremely hard to raise funds and food items to donate to farmers in need who are battling drought. The hard work we have all put in over the past few weeks compares to nothing to what our farmers are facing. The farmers are the backbone to this beautiful country we live in. Withour our farmers we would simply lose our identity. Everyone here today can relate to the hardship being faced by the farmers, either struggling themselves or know someone who is.

Over the past 3 weeks students and their families have been filling up their classroom with food and all sorts of items to create hampers to donate to the North Coast Drought Appeal. A few special mentions: the goodwill of Cooper B who was seen lugging in bags and bags of goods to the kindergarten room as well as Sebastian J who spent all \$25 of his pocket money on items to donate to the hampers. The hampers were accompanied with messages from the students to lift the farmers spirit.

Through the kind donations at the Bexhill Father's day Breakfast we raised \$77.00 with a gum boot throwing competition.

We also raised \$305.00 from our \$5A FOR A FARMER Draw and \$268.00 from our 'Dress up as Farmer' Mufti day. Students thoroughly enjoyed the sausage sizzle and fun farmer activities.

In total Bexhill Public School is proud to say we raised \$650.00 to donate towards the Drought Appeal. Mrs Ann Thompson was overwhelmed when she came to our Assembly last Friday to receive the generous donations on behalf of the North Coast Drought Appeal.

We cannot thank you all enough for the many kind donations. We hope this makes a difference and brings some ease to the stuggles being faced by our farmers.

#### P and C News

Thank you to all who attended Monday nights' meeting regarding the COLA upgrade through the use of a \$1 for \$1 grant, up to the P and C contribution of \$19000 which was applied for in 2015.

Mrs Craigie contacted the AMU representative prior to the meeting and was able to provide the group with an offer take up timeline so that we could make a more informed decision, these options were-

- Take up by October 30<sup>th</sup> 2018, with funds paid immediately, and works carried out during 6 week holidays this year, **or**
- Take up by February 28<sup>th</sup> 2019, with funds paid immediately, and works to be completed by June 30<sup>th</sup> 2019.

The decision was made to hold off on committing to the project until February 2019, as we will have fundraising money from the Bunnings BBQ and Movie night, plus resolution of Transport NSW money.

#### **Other Matters**

The issue was raised at the meeting regarding the school buildings and their need for repairs or ideally replacement. It has been noted that many of the demountable buildings are of a considerable age, with most having water leaks resulting in a constant damp smell and the concern of mould and mildew effecting many children and resulting in consistent illnesses and flare ups in asthma in some students. The P and C are encouraging parents with concerns about the state of the buildings and the effect it may have on their children to raise their concerns with the Department of Education and/or the office of Thomas George to see if a suitable resolution can be sort.


